element 1

Plan a web page.

performance criteria

- 1.1 The plan identifies the purpose of the web page and its intended audience.
- 1.2 The plan identifies text, heading, and graphics for the web page, and justifies selection in terms of purpose and target audience.

element 2

Produce and enter text for the web page with the aid of the template.

performance criteria

2.1 Text and heading are consistent with the plan, are entered on the web page, and checked for spelling and punctuation.

element 3

Select and place appropriate graphics to enhance the web page.

performance criteria

- 3.1 Graphics consistent with the plan are entered to enhance the page.
- 3.2 Completed web page is saved to a file.
